Workshop 1: Who can support me better?


Workshop 2: Making decisions about my life



Workshop 3: Legal capacity: what does it mean for me?



These tools are.




- A tool that translates text into images

That is why Sense has decided to do a campaign called "We All Need Friends"


In this campaign, Sense wants to have a place where people with intellectual disabilities can come and meet new people.

- Having all organizations and governments working together on the goals.




There will be many activities in Europe so that everyone can play an active part.

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#### Chinese restaurant offers jobs to people with intellectual disabilities.



In China, there is a restaurant that offers people with intellectual disabilities the chance to work.



It's called 'Forrest Gump', after the successful movie starring Tom Hanks.



Hu Yanging, the owner of the restaurant, already employed 12 people with disabilities.



Before getting hired, the staff has to do a training which is given by the local government.



The restaurant is very successful now and they have more clients. It is part of a government plan to help more people with disabilities gain work experience and eventually a proper job.



When they start working at the restaurant, the salary is about 300 Yuan which is around 40 euros.



They earn more money as they gain more experience.



Yanging told media that her restaurant is not aiming at making a lot of money. But she wants to offer people with intellectual disabilities the chance to have a job.



Cheng Dacheng is the chairman of the Provincial Disabled Person's Federation.



He wants to promote this experience all over the province. People with intellectual disabilities in China remain a vulnerable group.



They are not fully integrated in society.



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
